



YIMBUN RAILWAY STATION

Yimbun Railway Station was originally called Moorabool and was the terminus of the third section of the Brisbane Valley branch line (Esk to Moorabool) which opened on 1 September 1904.

The original Moorabool Station included an engine shed at the end of a fork, timber siding, goods shed siding, dead end to a loading bank and a 100-foot platform at rail level.

In 1906 the Moorabool Station name changed to Kannangur and finally Yimbun, meaning “bullrush”, in 1914. Between Yimbun and Harlin Station is the only tunnel on the Brisbane Valley line that is now heritage listed.
