TOUR 1 | TRANSPORT AND MANUFACTURING SHOWCASE

Milspec manufacturing factory

Milspec has been designing and supplying enclosures to the rail industry for over 15 years. Their product range has been specifically designed for the rail and outdoor industry requirements, meeting VRIOGS and ASA requirements. See the manufacturing process in action while visiting the factory.

NEXUS Industrial Precinct

Located 10km north of Albury's CBD, NEXUS is a 450ha site zoned to support large or heavy industrial development. The precinct spans the Hume Freeway and the main Melbourne-Sydney rail corridor, incorporating an intermodal hub. View the precinct and how it is supporting transport requirements in the region.

Ettamogah Rail Hub

The Ettamogah Rail Hub is a container handling, intermodal transport facility connecting the region to national and international markets. It includes its own rail sidings and direct access to the main Melbourne to Sydney rail line and Hume Freeway. The visit will showcase the Iron Highway, CargoSprinter, 3 Packs (PWAQ) Wagons and Y Class locomotives.



TOUR 2 | LOGIC – AUSTRALIA'S LOGISTICS HUB

Explore Logic, a multi-decade project that capitalises on its strategic position on the full diamond interchange of the Hume Freeway and Murray Valley Highway, and directly adjoins Inland Rail's north east railway line. Logic offers several significant advantages for industry seeking to create efficiencies in freight distribution, manufacturing and warehousing operations, reaching more than 75 per cent of Australia's population by next day transport.

Wodonga TAFE Logic Campus

Visit Wodonga's largest vocational training provider, delivering more than 2.5 million student contact hours in training every year. The \$12 million National Industrial Skills Training Centre at Logic opened in October 2012. The Centre provides training and licensing in the transport, logistics, warehousing, civil construction and forestry industries. Facilities include a fully-equipped warehouse for forklift and warehouse management training.

Woolworths Distribution Centre

See Woolworths' 60,000m² warehouse facility, which supplies more than 75 outlets across Northern Victoria and Southern NSW. See how the team manages \$2 billion worth of annual stock turnover and facilitates 450 truck movements daily.

SCT Wodonga Intermodal and Refrigeration Hub

SCT Logistics launched its first train from the Logic Intermodal on Thursday 13 October 2016.

The Wodonga terminal offers domestic and interstate rail line haul services, import and export container handling, and future warehousing and property solutions.

The 23-hectare site has direct access to the mainline rail track and features a 6000m² cross-dock terminal, a 5000m² container handling area and over 5km of internal rail track.

Since 2016, the SCT Barnawartha (Wodonga) Intermodal Hub has facilitated the delivery of 2000 tonnes of interstate freight and 180 TEU of import & export containers per week. Bi-directional access allows easy, fast, and efficient access for south or northbound freight.

Learn about the facility's current operations and future plans to expand to meet growing demand.
