"NAIDOC Week provides an opportunity to reaffirm Council's commitment to preserving and showcasing the cultural heritage of our region's Traditional Owners; the Bailai, the Gurang, the Gooreng Gooreng and the Taribelang Bunda people, as well as other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in our region."
