ADOPTION OF A PLANNING SCHEME POLICY AMENDMENT – AMENDMENT PACKAGE O

At its meeting on 14 November 2023, Brisbane City Council adopted amendments to the Air Quality, Management plans, Refuse and Transport, access, parking and servicing planning scheme policies (PSP) that support *Brisbane City Plan 2014* (Amendment package O). The amendment applies citywide and commenced on **8 December 2023**.

The amendment updates:

- the Air quality PSP to include a new air dispersion model as an option for preparing an air quality report in complex built environments.
- the guidance in the Management plans PSP on dust emission sources and control measures to be considered when preparing a noise, vibration and dust management plan.
- the Refuse PSP to:
 - amend the format of the PSP and include supporting information to clarify standards for access, manoeuvrability and clearances for refuse vehicles;
 - quantify non-residential refuse requirements including new service frequency requirements and refuse generation rates;
- the Transport, access, parking and servicing PSP to
 - remove a redundant parking standard and
 - amend service vehicle requirements for certain development types in the Transport, access, parking and servicing PSP to ensure refuse collection vehicles can be accommodated for on site.

MINOR AND ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT PACKAGE P AND MINOR AMENDMENT PACKAGE Q

At its meetings on 31 October and 28 November 2023 Brisbane City Council adopted a minor and administrative amendment (Minor and administrative amendment package P) and a minor amendment (Minor amendment package Q) respectively to *Brisbane City Plan 2014* including changes to planning scheme policies. Both the amendments apply citywide and commenced on **8 December 2023**.

The purpose and general effect of Minor and administrative amendment package P is to:

- Amend the zoning, Dwelling house character overlay and Traditional building character overlay of properties purchased under the Queensland Government’s Voluntary Home Buy-Back program to reflect the requirement the properties be non-habitable.
- Update the Flood overlay code and Flood planning scheme policy to clarify flood studies certification and update references and terminology.
- Update the Infrastructure design planning scheme policy to clarify Queensland Government requirements for referable dams.

The purpose and general effect of Minor amendment package Q is to:

- Update the Infrastructure design planning scheme policy to reflect the most up-to-date and accurate information in Brisbane Standard Drawings.
- Amend references to reflect the declaration of the Woolloongabba Priority Development Area.
