Gladstone Regional Council (Making of Local Law) Website Notice (No. 1) 2023

Title

1. This notice may be cited as *Gladstone Regional Council (Making of Local Law) Website Notice (No. 1) 2023*.

Making of subordinate local law

2. Gladstone Regional Council (the “Council”) has, by resolution dated the 5th day of December 2023, made—
 - (a) *Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads (Amendment) Subordinate Local Law (No. 1) 2023*; and
 - (b) *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.16 (Gates and Grids) 2023*.

Subordinate local law amended

3. The subordinate local law referred to in paragraph 2(a) amends *Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2011*.

Authorising local law

4. Local laws authorise the making of the subordinate local laws referred to in paragraph 2 as follows—
 - (a) *Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2011* authorises the making of *Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads (Amendment) Subordinate Local Law (No. 1) 2023*; and
 - (b) *Local Law No. 1 (Administration) 2011* authorises the making of *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.16 (Gates and Grids) 2023*.

Purpose and general effect

5. The purpose and general effect of the subordinate local laws referred to in paragraph 2 is as follows—
 - (a) *Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads (Amendment) Subordinate Local Law (No. 1) 2023* identifies, as a prescribed activity—
 - (i) installing a gate or a grid, or a gate and a grid, across a road; and
 - (ii) being a responsible person for a gate or a grid, or a gate and a grid, installed across a road;
 - (b) *Subordinate Local Law No. 1.16 (Gates and Grids) 2023* prescribes matters in relation to the undertaking of the prescribed activity, including—
 - (i) circumstances in which the requirement for an approval in respect of the undertaking of the prescribed activity does not apply;

- (ii) documents and materials that must accompany an application for an approval for the prescribed activity;
- (iii) criteria which must be satisfied before the local government may grant an approval for the prescribed activity;
- (iv) the conditions that must be imposed on an approval for the prescribed activity;
- (v) the conditions that will ordinarily be imposed on an approval for the prescribed activity;
- (vi) the term of an approval for the prescribed activity.

Inspection

6. A copy of each subordinate local law referred to in paragraph 2 may be—
- (a) inspected and purchased at Council's public office and viewed by the public on the website of Council; and
 - (b) viewed by the public on the website of the Department of Local Government.
