CONSULTATION PROCESS

4 x 3hr workshops (November & December 2023)

Delivered to 4 communities (Agnes Water, 1770, Captain Creek & Baffle Creek)

Consultation focused on:

- 1. Zoning & Industry
- 2. Open Spaces, (corridors, street trees & parks)
- 3. Town Centre (design & function)
- 4. Infrastructure & Essential Services
- 5. Access Ways (road, pedestrian & cycle)
- 6. Aesthetics (buildings & streetscapes)
- 7. Culture & Community



CONSULTATION PROCESS

- 1. 68 community members attended the 4 workshops
- 2. An online survey provided an additional 45 responses
- 3. A total of 113 community members contributed to the consultation
- 4. The final report was presented to GRC & Real Planning staff on 22 February
- 5. Objectives:
 - ✓ Introduce community to the planning process, and gather detailed views about current issues and priorities for Agnes Water region townships.
 - ✓ For community to participate in developing a future vision for the area.
 - ✓ Provide clear and solid recommendations to GRC.



FEEDBACK SUMMARY

- 1. Separate/reviewed local area planning (aligned to coastal/rural planning)
- 2. Strong desire to maintain a "village feel" in all our townships (interconnected, mixed-use zoning, limiting residential population, pre-planned wildlife corridors and public-resourced natural areas that are disability, pedestrian & recycle friendly)
- **3. Stricter rules on residential zoning** (block size, building design (eco) and height regulation, discourage heavy industry and large-scale/high-density residential and commercial developments)
- **4. Urgent address and upgrade of public services** (water security, desal, sewerage, connectivity, in accordance with projected demand driven by population increases and developments)



FEEDBACK SUMMARY

- **5. Improved standards of new roads/road infrastructure** (water drainage/diversion for Captain Creek and Baffle Creek-Deepwater, with greater consideration of environmental conditions, emergency and commercial access in their design)
- **6. Additional Commercial infrastructure** (public services, new business/ecotourism)
- 7. Additional Community infrastructure (community engagement & tourism)
- 8. Stronger environmental protection (inappropriate development, negative impacts of tourism and heavy industry, environmental management and protection of Agnes Water-Seventeen Seventy, in balance with public use and tourism)



RECOMMENDATIONS TO COUNCIL

- 1. Develop future Structural Plans aligned to the following categories:
 - Coastal
 - Rural
 - Commercial/Industrial
- 2. Use a **strategic approach in working with southern townships** in matters of local and regional planning.
- 3. Support continued consultation and other mechanisms that **encourage community to engage in local planning**.
- 4. Long-term strategies for **environmental protection**, **population management** and **essential services/infrastructure**.
