# 1.01.0 PURPOSE:

-------The purpose of this policy is to provide strategic direction on the management of Council controlled cometeries, crematorium and memorial parkland facilities<u>Cemeteries and</u> <u>Crematorium facility</u>.

# 2.02.0 SCOPE:

This Policypolicy applies to all cemeteries, crematoriumCemeteries and memorial parkland administered, the Crematorium operated and maintained by Council. -<u>It excludes</u> Cemeteries managed by private trustees and Burials that have occurred on private property. Burials on private property are managed under the *Gladstone Regional Council Subordinate Local Law No.* 1.13 (Undertaking Regulated Activities regarding Human Remains) 2011.

#### 5.05.0 DEFINITIONS:

To assist in interpretation of this policy the following definitions apply:

<u>"Applicant"</u> means the person making an <u>applicationApplication</u> for a <u>cemeteryCemetery</u> or <u>cremationCremation</u> service provided by <u>the BusinessCouncil</u>, that is subject to an <u>applicationApplication</u> process.

<u>"Application Form</u>" or <u>"Application</u>" means all forms which are required to be lodged with the BusinessCouncil or another Agency to undertake a service, or obtain an approval, within a Council controlled Cemetery and Crematorium.

"Ashes" means Cremated Remains placed in an Urn.

"Burial" means the act of burying the remains of a deceased person.

**Burial Rights** means exclusive rights to a Plot granted by the Business to a person, where they are given the rights to be interred in the Plot, to authorise the interment of others in the Plot, to establish or alter a memorial or monument on the Plot and to object or endorse an exhumation of a body or ashes in the Plot (there is no entitlement to any 'real estate' or property as such).

Burial Rights Holder is as defined in Section 6.5 of this Policy.

"Cemetery" or "Cemeteries" is as defined in Gladstone Regional Council's Local Law No. 1 (Administration) 2011 – Schedule 1 'local government Cometery' Cemetery' and as listed in Schedule 6 of Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Controlled Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2011.

**"Coffin"** used interchangeably to describe a coffinCoffin or casket.

**Corporate Standard** means Gladstone Regional Council's Management of Council Controlled Cemeteries and Crematorium Corporate Standard.

**Council**<u>"Council"</u> means Gladstone Regional Council and generally refers to the elected body of Council in their capacity as decision makers or Council as the ownership entity.

"Crematorium" means a building where human remains are burnt.

<u>"Cremated Remains</u>" means the human remains that have undergone the Cremation process and the body has been reduced to small pieces of ash and bone.

*"Cremation"* means the process of burning human remains.

"Exhumation" means the removal from the ground of a body or Ashes.

"Funeral Director" means an individual, or business carrying out a funeral service.

<u>"Interment"</u> means the Burial of a deceased person's remains in a coffinCoffin or in an Ashes Urn and/or niche or in other burial coverings such as burial shrouds.

**Memorial** "Interment Rights" means exclusive rights to a Plot granted by Council to a person, where they are given the rights to be interred in the Plot, to authorise the Interment of others in the Plot, to establish or alter a Memorial or Monument on the Plot and to object or endorse an Exhumation of a body or Ashes in the Plot (there is no entitlement to any 'real estate' or property as such).

"Interment Rights Holder" is the person that holds the Interment Rights as defined in this Policy.

<u>"Memorial"</u> means a Plot within a Council controlled Cemetery without an Interment which serves the purpose of a place of remembrance of a deceased person.

*"Monument"* means any structure, headstone, masonry, metal work, casting or item placed over, in, or around a Plot.

<u>"Monument Mason"</u> means a tradesman mason or person possessing the skills to carry out monument masonryMonument Masonry work.

"Next of Kin or Authorised Representative" means:

- <del>(a)</del>
- \_\_\_\_for a Cremation, the person authorised to act for the deceased person; andor
- (b) for an Interment, the person authorised to act for the deceased person where they are not the BurialInterment Rights Holder of a Plot.

<u>"Plot"</u> means a place for the Interment or memorialisation of the remains of a deceased person, whether <u>buried</u>, cremated or not.

*"Reservation"* means to pre-purchase a Burialan Interment Right for a Plot.

"Scattering" means to respectfully disperse the Ashes of a deceased person.

the Business means Gladstone Regional Council as an operating entity

"Urn" means a container for Cremated Remains. An Urn may include the Cremated Remains of one or more deceased persons.

## 6.1 CEMETERIES CONTROLLED BY COUNCIL

Parties There are seven open Cemeteries in the region and one restricted Cemetery for reserved Interments only. Six of the open Cemeteries are managed by Council and one managed by private trustees (Raglan Cemetery).

<u>All</u> other <u>Cemeteries in the Gladstone Region are either closed for future Burials and/or</u> administered by private trustees.

#### 6.1.1 Open Cemeteries

Bororen Cemetery;

- Boyne Tannum Memorial Parklands;
- Calliope Cemetery;
- Mount Larcom Cemetery;
- Port Curtis Cemetery; and
- Rosedale-Tottenham Cemetery.

#### **6.1.2 Restricted Cemeteries**

- Gladstone Cemetery is closed to all Burials and Reservations with the exception of:
  - burials in previously reserved Plots;
  - o Plots that have provision for double Interment; or
  - o Ashes Interments.

#### 6.1.3 Closed/Historical Cemeteries

The following Cemeteries are deemed to be historical and are closed for all Interments and Reservations:

- than the Business
- Beachton Cemetery (formally Keppel Bay Cemetery);
- Builyan Cemetery (formally Many Peaks Cemetery);
- Miriam Vale Cemetery;
- Nagoorin Cemetery;
- Norton Goldfields Cemetery;
- Rosedale Baffle Creek Cemetery (Flinders Cemetery); and
- Targinnie Cemetery.

#### 6.2 WORK AND OPERATING HOURS

- Other parties may undertake work, an activity within a, or access Cemeteries out of public opening hours, when authorised by Council.
- Burial services are only permitted during business days (excluding public holidays) and specific hours approved by Council. Approval is required by an authorised person outside these times and additional fees may be incurred.
- Public access is available to all Council controlled Cemetery when authorised. Cemeteries in accordance with Council's Subordinate Local Law No. 4 (Local Government Areas, Facilities and Roads) 2011.

#### 6.26.3 REGISTER OF BURIALS, CREMATIONS AND PLOT RESERVATIONS

The Business will maintain a<u>A</u> Cemetery Register will be maintained as a single digital database which and will contain the following information:

- <u>6.2.1.</u> All Interments and Memorials in Council controlled Cemeteries.- This may not include Interments in historical Cemeteries due to loss of records from previous operating entities.
- <u>6.2.2</u> Cremations as required by the *Cremations Act 2003* for each Cremation conducted by the BusinessCouncil.
- <u>6.2.3</u> Plot Reservations (for reservations made prior to the commencement of this Policy) which will record the BurialInterment Rights for a Plot reserved by a person within a Council controlled Cemetery.

## 6.36.4 EXHUMATION

- •\_\_\_\_<del>6.3.1 The Business</del>Council will not carry out Exhumations.
- <u>6.3.2</u> All arrangements for Exhumations are to be made with a registered Funeral Director.
- <u>6.3.3</u>Permission for Exhumation by a Funeral Director will only be granted to the BurialInterment Rights Holder onupon Application.

## **RESERVATIONS**

## 6.5 BURIAL

- Council will honour all Plot and Interment Reservations made prior to the adoption of this Policy.
- From the date of adoption of this Policy, Council will not accept new Plot and Interment Reservations.

# 6.46.6 INTERMENT RIGHTS

- •\_\_\_\_6.4.1 BurialInterment Rights which are reserved by a person may not be sold. Burials rights
- Interment Rights may be transferred when authorised by the BusinessCouncil.
- 6.4.2 A BurialAn Interment Right on a vacant or reserved Plot may be surrendered to the BusinessCouncil.
- 6.4.3 A full or partial refund may be given for relinquishing a reserved Plot.

# 6.56.7 BURIAL INTERMENT RIGHTS HOLDER

#### 6.5.1 6.7.1 General Conditions applying to all Interment Rights Holders

- •\_\_\_\_There can only be one BurialInterment Rights Holder per Plot.
- 6.5.2 The Burial Interment Rights Holders must comply with all rules and regulations which apply to the operation of Council Cemeteries and Crematorium.

#### 6.7.2 For Plot Reservations made before commencement of this Policy

• The Interment Rights Holder is the person whose name appears on the Application Form as the

Authorised Person for the purchase of a new Plot the reserved Plot. For historic reservations where there may not be records to support who the exact family member was who made the Reservation, Council will liaise with family members and act in good faith in determining who the Interment Rights Holder is for an interment, memorial or reservation. the Plot.

- <u>6.5.3</u> On the death of the Interment Rights Holder, where the Interment Rights Holder is interred or memorialised in the reserved Plot and there is capacity for further interments into the Plot, the Interment Rights for that Plot will follow the lines of succession of the Interment Rights Holder.
- On the death of the Interment Rights Holder, where the Interment Rights Holder is **not** interred or memorialised in the Reserved Plot the Interment Rights for that Plot will revert to Council.
- The BurialInterment Rights Holder has exclusive rights to be interred in the Plot, to authorise the intermentInterment of others in the Plot, to establish or alter a memorialMemorial or monument on the PlotMonument and to object or endorse an exhumationExhumation of a body or ashesAshes in the Plot. This is subject to the restrictions on the number of intermentsInterments permitted per Plot.
- <u>6.5.4</u> On<u>Council will consider an application to transfer</u> the death of the BurialInterment Rights Holder, on a reserved plot where the Burialoriginal Interment Rights Holder consents to the transfer (for example, the Interment Rights Holder may seek to transfer the responsibility of the Plot Reservation due to ill health).
- Where the existing Interment Rights Holder of the Plot is interred historic and the Interment Rights Holder cannot be found or memorialised in the Plot for which they hold the rights, the Burialcannot be accurately identified the Interment Rights for that Plot will follow the lines of succession of that holder, where the person whose name appears as the Authorised Person on the Application Form will become the new Burial Rights Holder of that Plot.revert to Council.
- 6.5.5 If there is a living Burial Rights Holder at the time of Application, the Burial Rights will not be transferred to a Next of Kin or Authorised Representative whose name appears on the Application Form (for example: A wife has a reserved Plot. Her husband passes, and their daughter completes the Burial Application for the reserved Plot. In this circumstance the wife maintains the Burial Rights and not their daughter, whose name appears on the Application Form the Application Form).
- <u>6.5.6</u> Where a Next of Kin or Authorised Representative is not the <u>BurialInterment</u> Rights Holder of the Plot and they make an Application for interment, memorial, <u>monumentalInterment, Memorial or Monumental</u> works or <u>exhumation</u>, <u>permissionExhumation</u>, the <u>application</u> must be <u>obtained in writing (accompanied</u> by <u>waythe</u> <u>written consent</u> of <u>approved form) from</u> the <u>BurialInterment</u> Rights Holder-<u>and submitted</u> with the <u>Application</u>.

6.5.7 On.3 For Memorials or Monumental Works and Burials into Plots that are not Reserved

- The person who appears as the death of the Authorised Person for a Burial Application on an unreserved plot becomes the Interment Rights Holder, where for the BurialPlot.
- <u>The Interment</u> Rights Holder is not interred or memorialised has exclusive rights to authorise the Interment of others in the Plot-for which they hold the rights, the Burial Rights for that Plot will revert to the Business., to establish or alter a Memorial or Monument and to object or endorse an Exhumation of a body or Ashes in the Plot. This is subject to the restrictions on

the number of Interments permitted per Plot.

- 6.5.8 Where the existing BurialCouncil will consider an application to transfer the Interment Rights where the original Interment Rights Holder of the Plot is historic or unknown, the Burial Rights for that Plot will revertconsents to the Business.
- 6.5.9 In the circumstance<u>transfer or</u>, where the Business is the Burial<u>Interment</u> Rights Holder of is deceased, it will follow the line of succession for the person interred in the Plot, and/or the Business at its' absolute discretion, will transfer the <u>Authorised Person for</u> the Burial Rights of the Plot to a spouse, child, partner, relative or direct descendant of the deceased by way of an approved Application, provided the Business has no reason to believe that the previous Burial Rights Holder (if known) would have objected to such transfer. This also applies to historic reservations, where the exact family member who made the reservation cannot be determined.

**Note:** The Business acts in good faith when it relies on advice provided by the Burial Rights Holder and when transferring Burial Rights and does not accept any responsibility for allowing a service that might be the subject of a later dispute between family members.

6.5.10 The Burial Rights Holder must comply with all rules and regulations which apply to the operation of Council's Cemeteries.

## 6.6 RESERVATIONS OF PLOTS

• <u>Reservations of Plots may be made in accordance with the Application process for Open</u> Cemeteries (see Section 6.14).

# 6.7 6.8 INTERMENTS

- <u>6.7.1</u> Interments willmay be accepted in a Council controlled Cemetery by Application in writing on the approved Application Form-and subject to approval by the Business.
- <u>6.7.2</u> The maximum number of Interments and the combination of the types of Interments into a single Plot will be determined by the <u>BusinessChief Executive Officer or nominated delegate</u>.
- <u>6.7.3</u> Further Burial Interments into a single Plot are best performed after one year from the first Burial Interment, however, the Business will<u>Council may</u> accept Applications for a further Burial Interment into a Plot prior to one-year subject to:
  - (a) The Applicant being advised and acknowledging the risks and the potential conditions and issues that may arise from re-opening the Plot; and
  - (b) Any conditions that the BusinessCouncil may place on the Interment approval.
  - <u>The BusinessCouncil</u> reserves the right to refuse an Application for a further Burial Interment into a Plot where it considers that Plot conditions are not suitable for re-opening at a particular point in time.
- <u>6.7.4</u> All Plots are allocated by the <u>Business.Chief Executive Officer or nominated delegate</u>. Applicants can select free-standing Plots from those available in pre-determined locations.
- <u>6.7.5</u> Specific cultural or religious requirements are to be advised in writing at time of Application. <u>The BusinessCouncil</u> will endeavour to grant the requirements of each request subject to operational <u>and Cemetery management</u> considerations. <u>The Business will not</u> <u>allow members of the public</u>

- <u>Council may grant approval for entry</u> to <u>enter</u> an excavated Plot prior to <u>or during an</u> Interment to place items or perform religious or cultural <u>preparatory</u> activities <u>— these must be performed</u> <u>outside of subject to any safety requirements imposed by Council and/or the Funeral Director</u> <u>providing the excavationBurial service</u>.
- 6.7.6 Animal Burials are prohibited in Council Cemeteries.

## 6.8 6.9 SCATTERING OF ASHES

- <u>The Business will atAt</u> the request of Applicants arrange for our People to <u>Council Officers can</u> scatter Ashes in designated areas of Council Cemeteries.
- Individuals wanting to perform this function in person within a Council controlled Cemetery may do so by arrangement with the Business. Chief Executive Officer or nominated delegate.

#### 6.9 6.10 CREMATIONS

- 6.9.1 Coffins will not be opened by Council Officers once accepted into the Crematorium.
- <u>6.9.2 The BusinessCouncil</u> accepts no responsibility for items (flowers, cards, covers, jewellery, ornaments etc.) left on, or in, the coffinsCoffins once it has been accepted into the Crematorium.

## 6.11 REQUEST FOR BURIAL OR CREMATION OTHER THAN VIA A FUNERAL DIRECTOR

- Applications for a Burial or Cremation Service where a Funeral Director has not been engaged, may be accepted subject to the Applicant providing all the necessary supporting information that evidences that the Applicant has met the legislative and legal requirements for Burial or Cremation of a deceased person.
- The remains of the deceased person must be presented for Burial or Cremation in a way that ensures the protection of public health and allows for the safe and respectful handling of the remains as determined at the sole discretion of the Chief Executive Officer or nominated delegate.
- The Chief Executive Officer or nominated delegate may engage the services of an external party in conducting the required assessments under Section 6.11.1 and 6.11.2, the costs of which are to be met by the Applicant for Burial or Cremation.

# 6.10 \_\_PLAQUES, MONUMENTS AND INSCRIPTIONS

- <u>6.10.1</u> Memorial plaques are the responsibility of the **Burial**Interment Rights Holder and may be organised through a Funeral Director or a private supplier.
- 6.10.2 A person shall not, in any Council controlled Cemetery, construct or install any Monument, <u>memorial Memorial</u>, foundation, vault, table, headstone, gravestone, kerbing, railing or other structure, and/or make any inscription or carry out any adornment, unless:

a) written approval for same is obtained from the Burial Interment Rights Holder; and

b) such works are in accordance with the standards required within that Cemetery; and

c) \_\_\_\_\_ approved in writing by the Business Council.

- <u>6.10.3</u> Except where work is essential to make a Plot safe, <u>the BusinessCouncil</u> will not be liable for the repair, maintenance, upkeep or preservation of any plaque or item placed on a Plot. The responsibility for the costs of repairs and maintenance to plaques, <u>monumentsMonuments</u> and historical graves and headstones, lie with the <u>BurialInterment</u> Rights Holder.
- <u>6.10.4</u> Funeral Directors and Monumental Masons are to ensure the person ordering a plaque / Monument is the <u>BurialInterment</u> Rights Holder or has obtained written permission from the <u>BurialInterment</u> Rights Holder.
- <u>6.10.5</u> The BusinessCouncil must be notified by way of lodgement of an Application prior to any maintenance or repair work being carried out.
- <u>6.10.6</u> Monuments, gravestones, kerbing, railing and other structures are not permitted within lawn sections of Council controlled Cemeteries with the exception of Bororen Cemetery and Rosedale-<u>Tottenham</u> Cemetery which will accept a headstone.

# 6.11 6.13 VASES, FLOWERS, MEMORABILIA AND ORNAMENTS ON -PLOTS

• <u>6.11.1</u> Vases, flowers, memorabilia and ornaments on Plots must comply with the Business'sCouncil's requirements. Information will be publicised on these requirements. In setting the standards, the BusinessCouncil will aim to achieve a balance between the needs of loved ones to show love and remembrance through the placement of floral and ornamental tributes, with maintaining the visual and environmental amenity and safety of the Cemetery.

• <u>6.11.2</u> <u>The BusinessCouncil</u> reserves the right, without notice, to remove and dispose of any object that does not comply with publicised requirements.

# 6.12 CLOSED CEMETERIES

The following Cemeteries are deemed to be historical and are closed for all Interments and Reservations:

- Miriam Vale Cemetery
- Targinnie Cemetery
- Builyan Cemetery
- Nagoorin Cemetery
- Baffle Creek Cemetery.

#### 6.13 RESTRICTED USE CEMETERIES

The Gladstone Cemetery, Cemetery Road, Gladstone is closed to all Burials and Reservations with the exception of:

a) Burials in previously reserved Plots; and

- b) Plots that have provision for double Interment; and
- <u>C)</u><u></u> Ashes Interments.

## 6.14 OPEN CEMETERIES

The following Cemeteries are open: 7.0

- Bororen Cemetery Bruce Highway south of the Bororen;
- Boyne Tannum Memorial Parklands (includes Crematorium) Pioneer Drive, Boyne Island;
- Calliope Cemetery, 60 Morcom Street, Calliope;
- Mount Larcom Cemetery, 47 Popenia Road, Mt Larcom;
- Port Curtis Lawn Cemetery Aerodrome Road, Clinton Gladstone;
- Rosedale Cemetery Ferry Road, Rosedale.
